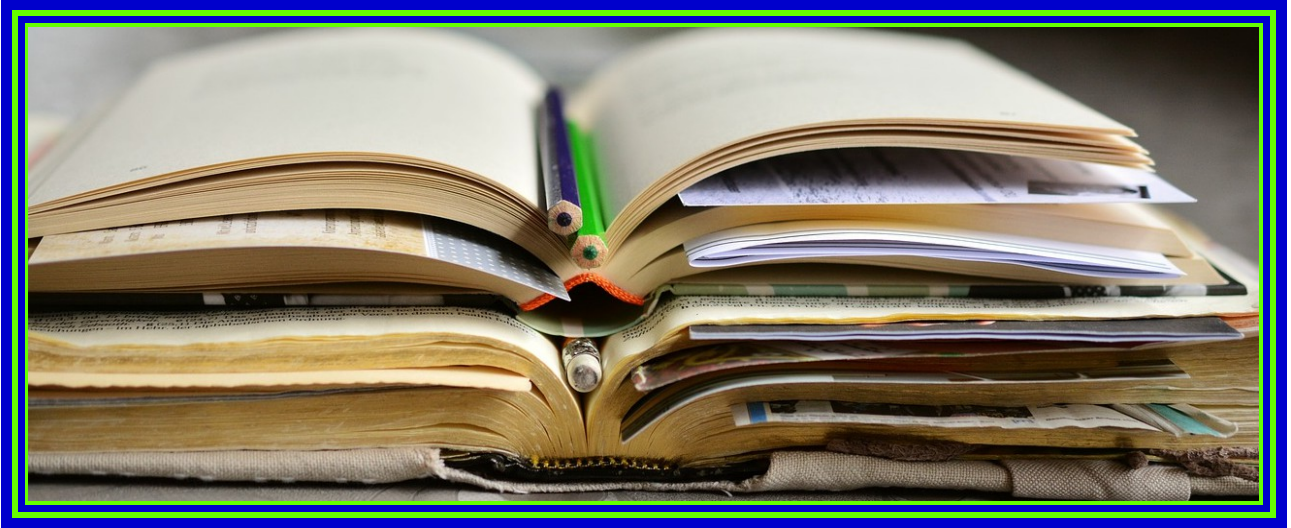


Facilius est paupertatem laudare quam ferre.¹

1 Greece

Try to learn the names all the characters you have met in the legends so far and something of their exploits.

2 Rome

Try to learn the names of the historical figures you have met in the stories so far and something of the events connected with them.

¹ It is easier to praise poverty than to bear it. Seneca. Notice *laudare* "to praise" (infinitive), and *est* "is." You might have guessed *paupertatem* and possibly *facilius*. Which English words are related to these two words? Answer on next page.

Answers:

paupertatem is related to “pauper” – a poor person.

Facilius is related to words such as “facilitate” to make easy, “facile” – simplistic and “facilities.”
