Gratia, gratiae is another 1^{st} declension noun and *gratiā* is the ablative singular form – "with, from or **by grace**."

Answers:

- 1. Bible teaches that our salvation comes from God as a free gift.
- 2. Many people want to think they have a rôle to play in their own salvation because the idea of *solā gratiā* is culturally alien. They have been taught to believe that they should consider themselves in charge of their own destiny.
- 3. This doctrine helps us understand that there is nothing in us that makes us merit salvation in the slightest degree.
