Year 2 Term 1 Week 8 Day 1 Grammar: Numbers



Before we start second conjugation verbs we need to learn our Latin numbers. You will find these listed on *Latin Without Tears* p.147b. The numbers from 1 to 3 behave like adjectives in that they have to agree with the noun they qualify in respect of gender and case. You can see how this works if you look at *Latin Without Tears part 4/Latin Numbers Worksheet/The Numbers 1, 2 and 3* on *the Mothers' Companion* Volume 8. (Pages 157b and 158a of *Latin Without Tears* also have the numbers one and two set out for you but the exercises that follow include second conjugation verbs.) The other numbers are easy as they do not change their endings. There are also quizzes covering the numbers from one to twenty in this section of the flashdrive. You can complete these by studying p.147b of *Latin Without Tears*. This lists the numbers from one to thirty. Then the same pattern is followed for forty (*quadraginta*) and fifty (*quniquaginta*). Notice how with eighteen, and nineteen etc. the pattern of the Latin words reflects the way Roman numerals are written. Write the Roman numeral beside each number listed on page 147b. Make sure your learn the numbers and test yourself on them.
