Grammar: reflexive pronouns, demonstrative pronouns

Latin Without Tears page 236b lists reflexive (or reflective) pronouns. I cannot find them mentioned in the IGCSE syllabus but it would not do any harm to be aware of them. The demonstrative pronouns (pp.237-8) however, you will definitely need.

Bible examples:

hic est liber generationis Adam, in die qua creavit Deus hominem, ad similitudinem Dei fecit illum
Genesis 5:1

I think you might be able to do this. If you can't guess *illum*, here it is:

Ille “that/those/he/she/it/him/her...” as appropriate:

scribe ergo quae vidisti et quae sunt et quae oportet fieri post haec Revelation 1:19
oportet “it is necessary” + *fieri* “to take place” i.e. “will happen.” *Scribe* is imperative.
