Grammar: more demonstrative pronouns

Latin Without Tears pages 239-240 lists the *qu...* demonstrative pronouns. You have already met many of them. I suggest you learn page 240 before looking at the examples on page 239. Note that *cujus* is usually written *cuius* nowadays.

Bible examples:

beatus qui legit et qui audiunt verba prophetiae Revelation 1:3a
beatus “blessed” I think you will get the rest.

cuius vox movit terram Hebrews 12:26a
You can do this! *Vox* is the subject of *movit*.

beatus vir cui non inputabit Dominus peccatum Psalm 32:2a
peccatum “sin” second declension neuter – goes like *bellum*. You can do the rest I think. *Dominus* is the subject of *inputabit* guess and note the ...*bit* ending to get the tense.
