

## Year 2 Term 2 Week 4 Day 1

### Grammar: third conjugation verbs

*Latin Without Tears* pages 193-201a give further practice in third conjugation verbs. Work through the exercise in the usual way.

Notice that the verb *Credere*, “takes the dative” that is in Latin you literally say, “I believe **to** my father” which is how *Latin Without Tears* renders it. However, when you translate these sentences, although you should be aware of the use of the dative you should translate it as “I believe my father.”

Bible examples:

*at ille ait “credo Domine” et procidens adoravit eum* John 9:38

*ait* is “said”, *procidens* is “falling down” can you guesslate the rest?

*omnis enim qui petit accipit*

*et qui quaerit invenit*

*et pulsanti aperietur* Matthew 7:8

*accipit*, “he will receive” *invenit* “he will find”. The *ur* ending on *aperietur* indicates the passive form of the verb which we have not yet covered so “it will be opened” rather than “it will open.” *quaerit* “seeks” and you can probably guesslate the rest.
