Grammar: fifth declension nouns

Latin Without Tears pages 200b-206 introduces the fifth declension. Work through the exercises in the usual way. Learn to chant these nouns in the normal way.

Bible Examples:

huius rei gratia flecto genua mea ad Patrem Domini nostri Iesu Christi Ephesians 3:14

The noun *res* is an important one used in a wide variety of situations. *gratia* can mean “sake”. To genuflect is to bend the knee. Can you guess the rest?

spe enim salvi facti sumus, spes autem quae videtur non est spes, nam quod videt quis quid sperat?
Romans 8:24

spe is ablative “by hope.” *salvi facti* “made saved” *videtur* the *ur* ending indicates the passive form of the verb which we have not yet covered i.e. “is seen.” *quid* is “why” *sperat* “he hopes.” Can you guess the rest?
