Now spot test yourself using verbs other than *regere*. For the **perfect, pluperfect and future perfect tenses** the tester will have to refer to the syllabus <a href="https://www.cambridgeinternational.org/Images/414212-2020-2022-syllabus.pdf">https://www.cambridgeinternational.org/Images/414212-2020-2022-syllabus.pdf</a> to find the correct stem. You will see that they are listed in the form *rego*, *-ere*, *rexi*, *rectum so* the stem you need for the active is third on the list and the last one is the stem you need for the passives.

<sup>1</sup> Notice that the only difference between the present and the future simple here is the quantity of the *e*. If the quantity of the *e* is not marked you will have to make a judgement based on context when translating.
