We will now tackle the second question on the paper we looked at in the lesson for Week 5 this term. You will need Paper 1 June 2011 for today's exercise which you should be able to download here if you did not print it all out for week 5:

As before, take notice of the summary in English that heads the paragraph in Latin. You do not need to make a translation of this passage, indeed there will not be time for you to do that in the exam. Instead, read it and make some notes. Again, all the vocabulary will be in your syllabus except that which is given on the paper. If you can't quite understand some of the story, don't worry, the questions themselves will actually give you more information which will help you answer. As this is a practice, look up any word you do not know on the vocabulary list in the syllabus – and make sure you learn it for next time. As this is quite an old paper the vocabulary list on the current syllabus is not quite the same. *Depositus* as you might guess is "deposited" *extracta est* "was extracted/pulled out".

Remember to look at the number of marks allocated for each question. Question (c), for instance, has 3 marks allocated which means you can make 3 points. The first question is worth 6 marks. The second has 2 marks. Do the best you can to answer all the questions and then check your answer with the mark scheme which you can down load at

Question (a) notice the way the marks are allocated; you have to be quite careful about each exact little piece of information. This applied to all the questions.

Question (j) gives only example answers; yours may differ. Regalia; transmit; mutation; dispute and compute are all possibilities that I thought of and you may have thought of others. **Do not write down more that four words**. Only four marks are available and if you get a fifth or sixth word incorrect your incorrect answer may be marked and your correct answer ignored. They give "peninsula" on the mark scheme because this word derives from the Latin *paene insula*: "almost an island".
