I thought this was quite hard. *Arcessitus* “summoned” was tricky, and there were a number of places where, although the general drift was clear, it was easy not to get exactly the right constructions. For instance, *felicissime* makes so much more sense when you remember that *felix* means “lucky” as well as “happy”. *ut nullo negante sibi regem fieri liceret* was difficult:
